The **Mohawk Hudson Humane Society** held their **500 Pet Celebration** in August. The event offered discounts in pet adoptions, vendors with pet supplies of all kinds, food, music, and more in support of our four-legged friends.

I had an opportunity to tour another business in Menands in August. *Thrive Fitness & Weliness* relocated therefitness center from 381 Broadway to 21 Simmons Lane in April of this year. The new location has expanded the workout space from 900 sq. ft to 5000 sq. ft, which will accommodate more people, while maintaining small class sizes and personalized fitness plans. Co-owners Derek Gelato, a personal trainer for 13 years and Brandon Gallagher, who holds a BA in Human Biology from SUNY Albany, strive to improve their client's quality of life through physical fitness, nutrition and stress management. An interesting story Derek told me during the tour was regarding one of their clients, Jim who is a 70-year-old powerlifter. Jim and Derek started working together 3 ½ years ago on general fitness, when Jim was unable to sit down and stand back up without difficulty. Jim regained his strength and improved his quality of life, being able to do everyday tasks, hiking and other things. Jim now enters competitions, with the most recent being the USAPL Northeast Regionals in Connecticut on July 28<sup>th</sup>. Here, Jim Back Squatted 286 lbs., Bench Pressed 186 lbs. and Deadlifted 385 lbs. placing 1<sup>st</sup> in his age division and weight class. Congratulations to Jim on this remarkable accomplishment and best wishes to Derek and Brandon on the success of their business, with thanks for selecting Menands as their place to call home.

Upgrades to the Nature Trail will begin soon, made possible in part from a \$125,000 SAM grant received with the assistance of Assemblyman Phil Steck. We are excited for the outcome and look forward to a ribbon cutting for the community to see what the trails have to offer. Additional funding has been made available to the Village to continue upgrades to our parks. Thank you to Assemblyman Steck for bringing these opportunities to Menands.

Work continues with the Village Comprehensive Plan and is expected to be completed by the end of this year. I am grateful to Chazen Companies and the volunteer members of this committee (Kerry Wroblewski, Jerry and Nancy Ruppert, Bill Nevins, Aileen Nicoll and Dr. Maureen Long) for their dedication to this project.

The Village was awarded a **technical assistance grant** through **CDTC/CDRPC**, to assist with exploring food options in **Menands**. The grant consists of **\$10,166** award with a local match of **\$2,541** for a total of **\$ 12,707**, to identify options to increase food accessibility. The **Food Committee** continues to meet to gather information to establish strategies, potential partners, or activities designed to provide greater accessibility of food options in our Village.

**Military Banner** orders have started to come in, with the first couple hung proudly along **Broadway**. This is an ongoing program and we look forward to displaying more banners of our military heroes. Thank you to **Diane Foley** for her efforts with this project.

Due to issues with the approval process with the RR to pave and stripe on **Simmons Lane** near the tracks, the **Quiet Zone** project is further delayed. Our engineers are continuing to work on the proper permits and hope to have things in order next summer to finally get the **Quiet Zone** in place.

I look forward each year to the **Fall Display** on the island along **Broadway**. This year is no exception. Soon enough the vibrant fall colors will be on display.
