On behalf of the Applicant, Vertical Bridge Development, LLC and Cellco Partnership (d/b/a Verizon Wireless) we are hereby submitting a Preliminary Site Plan Application for the above-referenced project for the Village of Menands Board of Trustees (Village Board) meeting that has been scheduled for Tuesday, June 21, 2022, at 6:00 pm.

Project Statement

The proposed Project involves the construction of 150-ft high telecommunication monopole tower inside a secured fenced enclosure. The site will be an un-manned operation. Wireless carriers will install their antennas and radio equipment on the monopole and use ground space for their associated radio equipment. Vehicle access to the tower will be through existing property via an access easement granted by the property owner. Underground electrical service will connect though existing property to the tower equipment inside the enclosure. No water or sanitary utilities are proposed. Total site disturbance is approximately 0.3 acres, which warrants erosion control practices, but precludes the need for a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). No other federal or state permits are required. A Flood Hazard Area Permit Application will be submitted to the Village Code Enforcement Officer following the Site Plan review process and prior to construction activity.

On June 2, 2022, the Village ZBA adopted two resolutions two (2) decisions regarding the Project. The first was the issuance of a Negative Declaration under the State Environmental Quality Review Act pursuant to its role as Lead Agency for coordinated review of the Project. The second decision was to approve a use variance for the Project.

All previously submitted Project materials that were considered for the ZBA's decisions are hereby incorporated into the Village's overall file records for this Project. All previously submitted Project materials remain on file with the Village Clerk.

The following documents have been enclosed for review and consideration:

- 1. **Site Plan Application**, *prepared for a Preliminary Site Plan Review* because the Project has been well-developed through the ZBA Use Variance Application process.
- 2. Site Plan Application Checklist, prepared for a Preliminary Site Plan Review.
- 3. **Preliminary Site Plans** (16 sheets, sized 11x17), prepared by Creighton Manning Engineering, LLP, last revised June 10, 2022.
 - copies of the foregoing are enclosed for Village Board members for Site Plan review.
 - 1 copy of the foregoing is to be retained at the Village Offices for the public's review.
