MAYOR'S CORNER

• The renovations are complete at the new Village Boardroom at 250 Broadway in our main municipal building. We have improved the audio and video so everyone can attend in person OR online to participate in our municipal administration. - The official project groundbreaking for the South End Infrastructure Project was held on September 24th
 at the Hutton St Park. This \$17 million upgrade to our water and sewer infrastructure is long overdue.
 While this project will take 2 years to complete, these improvements will serve Menands for 50 years or
 more! Please be patient with our work.
- I look forward to leading the Halloween Trunk-or-Treat parade for our annual kids' costume party at the Menands Farmer's Market Pavilion on October 19th. There will be activities for kids, and the parade kicks off at 2 pm. Kids should arrive by 1:45 pm to participate.
- I was honored to participate in a Back-to-School outdoor movie night on August 27th at the Schuyler Inn. Ryan Graham from Altamont Programs helped put it together, and we watched Moana 2 with dozens of kids.
- We are working with a prominent Menands-based business to expand here in our village. While I cannot share the details at this time, Deputy Mayor Tim Lane and I are constantly working to attract new business development in Menands. This will be a massive win for us, and I hope to announce the progress next month.

A Presidential Wreath Laying Ceremony at the grave of Chester A. Arthur will take place on Monday, October 6, 2025, at 11:00 AM at Albany Rural Cemetery. Cemetery section 24.

AVOID THE RE-LEVY PENALTY!

The last day to pay delinquent Village Tax or Village Water bills is October 31, 2025. After that date, any amount still owed will be sent to Albany County for re-levy. A \$50 fee will also apply. These amounts, with interest, will then be payable by January 31, 2026, with your Albany County General Taxes.

HISTORY OF MENANDS IN OCTOBER

Albany Rural Cemetery opened on October 7, 1844, and held its opening ceremony, with a large procession starting in downtown Albany and ending at the cemetery's present-day location in Menands. The cemetery has since become the final resting place for many historical American figures.

October 28, 1890: Howard Menand, the great-grandson of village namesake Louis Menand, was born in the village. He later became the village's first official historian.

Halloween trolley accident, Halloween Day, 1928: A 13-yearold child of Italian immigrants, Sammy Severino, died in a trolley accident while attempting to ride on the back of a trolley. He sadly fell off and was killed.

Halloween ghost story, October 30, 2005: The Troy Record published an article about haunted tales surrounding Menands Manor, a historic building that had once been the Home for Aged Men of Albany. A former police chief stated that while some ghost stories persisted, the building's renovation hadn't deterred claims of strange noises and moving objects. NYCON now owns the building at 272 Broadway.

Kevin Franklin – Village Historian: Kevin and his wife Kerry, along with their three children, Danny, Brian, and Erin, have been integral members of the Village for many years. Kevin Franklin has devoted a significant portion of his life to serving as the Village Historian. He began his career as a patrolman with the Menands Police Department and eventually rose to the position of Chief of Police. After he retired from the Menands Police Department, Kevin was appointed Town Historian of Colonie. He is also a lifelong member of the Menands Fire Company.
