MENANDS DPW

Menands DPW is asking for your help with the following:

- Trash and recycling MUST be out by 7 AM.
- Prohibited Items We will not take: Wet paint (dry or absorb with cat litter first), TVs, computer monitors, medical waste, propane tanks, tires, and ANY contractor/renovation materials (private contractors must dispose of these materials).
- While clearing your driveway or sidewalk of snow, DO NOT put the snow back into the street.
- Yard waste must be in compostable bags, barrels, and limbs cut to a reasonable size (4ft) to fit in the DPW truck.
- If there is a fire hydrant near your home, if possible, please clear it of snow. Be a hydrant hero!

SOUTH END WATER SEWER PROJECT

The South End Water and Sewer Infrastructure upgrade project is taking a short winter break and will resume in the spring of 2026 to complete all work within 18 months. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience caused by water main breaks during the project— these were unfortunately unavoidable. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work to improve our Village's infrastructure for future generations of residents.



SEASONAL LEAF COLLECTION

The early snowstorm cut our leaf collection season short. DPW will take bagged leaves each Friday with weekly yard waste collection. We will bring the leaf vacuum out THIS SPRING 2026 to collect leaves and will provide advance notification via the Everbridge communication system. VILLAGE WATER AND SEWER BILL REMINDER

Village water and sewer bills are due without penalty by February 16, 2026. Please remember that homeowners are responsible for all Village bills and for ensuring timely payment, even if a bill is delayed or lost in the mail. Payments received after February 16 must include a 10% penalty. Payments received in envelopes not postmarked on or before 2/16 will not be accepted without the required penalty and will be returned. Payments can be made through Xpress-Pay, by mailing a check, or in person at the Village Office. Pay online at MenandsNY.gov
